## Description

Single horse, tiller and farmer.; a) horse and harrow; b) driver, standing man.; From Megan Berner's worksheet: "Sculpture constructed by cut .25 inch pine boards. It depicts two horses approximately 7.5 inches tall, pulling a sled approximately 9 inches long. The sled has two runners that are each attached to the upper box by three blocks of wood. The sled carries three milk cans each about 3 inches tall. The sled is attached to the horses by a yoke constructed of wood and thin rubber that has been glued on. The sled has been constructed using small wire nails and a screw, as well as glue that seems to have been applied at most of the joints. The legs of the horses have been glued on. The set includes a wooden man whose arms, legs, and feet have been glued on. Both the man and the horses have been detailed in pencil. The bottom of the sled has been signed and dated by the artist.
