Description

This a maple and lead pipe bowl, on bottom there is a lead infill motif in the shape of an otter. The bowl is in the shape of a head with the face looking toward the smoker. The face has an elongated nose and mouth with a small triangular shape for ears. The pipe stem has waves carved into it on the top and on the side's decorative elements of squares with Xs in the center.
