Description

Shot pouch of skin, wood, porcupine quills, sinew and inside there is a loose white tag in black ink: "A77176" with a circular red label and a circular black label. The pouch is rectangular in shape with the lower half of the pouch narrower than the top. All designs are against undyed hide. At the top there are designs in red, blue, and white quills. The next section of designs has diagonal red and white quills on the vertical edges, blue quills on the

top edge, and 42 blue quill wrapped tassels on the bottom edge. The tassels also have another white quill tie and red fringe. The design in the center of that section is on a white quill background and is geometric shapes in red and blue quills. The center design is a cross with two diamonds and a red square in the center. This entire section repeats itself below the tassels, minus the blue quill border on the top. The bottom row has 31 blue wrapped tassels, however more of the fringe is brown instead of red.
