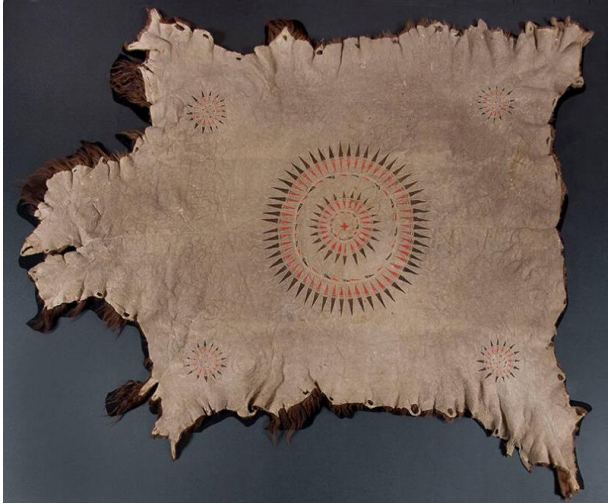


# Basic Detail Report

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## Buffalo Robe

### Date

1845

### Primary Maker

Mandan, Arikara, Hidatsa

### Medium

Buffalo hide, pigments

### Description

Buffalo robe of buffalo hide and pigments. Most of the robe is without pigment. In the center there is a circle made of brown and red triangles. The brown triangles are the first circle and point outward. The second circle is red triangles that point inward, making a diamond shape with the brown triangles. The same circle is then repeated and in that circle is a red cross. On what would have been the leg/shoulder area of the animal is the same circle but much smaller and only one later. There is a small red dot within the circle. Along the edges of the hide are holes in the skin that were probably used for stretching and tanning.

### Dimensions

Overall: 103 × 86 in. (261.6 × 218.4 cm)
