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## Moccasins

### Date

c. 1830

### Primary Maker

Seneca (Haudenosaunee)

### Medium

Deer skin, dyed porcupine quills, silk ribbon, glass beads, thread

### Description

These moccasins exemplify early 19th-century Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) porcupine quillwork as seen in the geometric and curvilinear designs that nearly cover the surface. Women often bordered the cuffs with richly-colored silk ribbon to complement the dyed quillwork.
