## Description

During the mid-18th century many Native peoples living in the northeast turned their skills to basket making as a means of economic survival in the vastly changing environment of colonial North America. Many basketweavers decorated the ashwood splints with painted designs by using a stamp, either of potato, cork or wood. This particular basket is fairly unusual because it is handpainted.
