Men wore embroidered kilts such as this at dances and ceremonies. Kilts were also sometimes used as banners. Rain was a fundamental part of the visual culture of the parched Southwest and was symbolized on the kilts. The white cotton represents a cloud and black braid along the bottom symbolizes rain. textile
