Description

This feast bowl fragment, one side of a central bowl that had attached flanking bowls, originally measured over 14 feet long. It represents the Sisiutl, an especially powerful serpent-like being associated with warriors. The right to use a great Sisiutl feast bowl was inherited through marriage among noble Kwakiutl families. It communicated the owner's rights and privileges as a high ranking member of the community.
