Description

This type of basket with its glowing mosaic of brilliant feathers is called a Jewel basket. Pomo basket makers painstakingly collected numerous fine feathers to create these extraordinary baskets. This basket has red crest

feathers from a woodpecker, dark iridescent feathers from a hummingbird and a blackbird, green feathers from a mallard, white feathers from a water bird and black crest feathers from a California quail. These baskets were often given as gifts to friends or were presented to honored persons.
