Description

This exquisitely modeled dagger hilt with its delicate tiny figures has the same visual impact as full-size totem poles. It depicts a bear holding a frog in its mouth and forefeet, with a human face and arms spilling out between and through the bear's ears. The blending of two figures in the same space symbolizes spiritual interrelationship, a hallmark of Northwest Coast art.
