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## Sash

**Date**

c. 1830

**Primary Maker**

Choctaw

**Medium**

Wool cloth, glass beads, silk binding, cotton backing, thread

**Description**

Typical 19th-century Choctaw sashes bore this popular double scroll design similar to those found on ancient

Southeastern pottery. Sashes such as these were worn around the waist or in pairs crossed over the chest. The sash is probably the earliest component of traditional dress still in use today.
