Description

Saddlebags are the most impressive and striking pieces of Apache horse equipment. The Apache emphasized their cut-work patterns on the saddlebags by backing the design with red cloth. The application of a golden ochre enriched the surface of the hide and complemented the red cloth. Cut-work also appears on the fringes. Francisco Vasquez de Coronado introduced horses to the region in the 1540s and the Apache quickly adopted the horse and

became an equestrian culture.
