

Description

Inward curling lines, often referred to as double curve motifs, are prominent design elements on these bags and may symbolize vegetation and bounty. Similar beadwork is found on formal clothing such as chief's coats, hoods, caps, moccasins, and sashes. Micmac beadworkers often selected the finest red or blue wool since it provided a rich contrast to their intricate beadwork. Extant Mi'kmaq
