One of these men is Heyward, in a red coat and a black tri-corner hat with gold trim and seated on a brown horse. The other man is wearing a blue coat and brown leggings and a black tri-corner hat, seated on a white horse. In front of these two characters is a brown colt that is suckling from the white horse.
