Iroquois Burl Bowl/Cup w/ Head Effigy; Paper inside: "This

drinking cup was taken from the Indians, in the time of the Revolutionary War, by James Parshall, of Middlefield, who was a Soldier. Presented by his grand son, Dr. J.G. Parshall, 1892." An oval wooden bowl with rounded bottom and a head and shoulders; carved figure of a man with a flat hat/hair on one long side rim. There also is a scar or something articulated above the left eye of the figure. A double beaded rim encircles the bowl. Colors: brown, black and copper.
