

Phone Croghan 3634." Yancey's Sugar Bush is still in business today in Lewis County, New York. Per Haskell and Jane Yancey: This sign is still on the back of the boiling shed, although it is barely legible today. Yancey's Sugarbush is in its fourth generation of ownership and currently owned by Haskell and Jane Yancey, who bought the Sugarbush in 1982 from Joseph

Yancey (third generation owner). They ran the Sugarbush with Joseph until his death in 1995. The fifth generation of Yancey's also assist with the operations.
